Some tuition at all two year colleges in South Carolina is covered by the LTAP (Lottery Tuition Assistance Plan) regardless of income or GPA. The LTAP does require completion of the FAFSA as soon as you complete your tax returns each year. Many scholarships and institutional money require completion of the FAFSA yearly. See your counselor if you have questions. See www.fafsa.ed.gov funding your education site to apply on-line. A new FAFSA form is developed each year and has been available since January 1, 2008 on their website. Use your 2007 income tax returns to complete this form on-line.

American Legion Scholarship – Can attend college **free** in S.C. if parent was a war time veteran and met certain criteria: 1) was KIA 2) died while in service 3) died of disability resulting from service 4) was POW 5) is permanently and totally disabled, as determined by the VA from any cause 6) was awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor 7) is MIA or 8) applicant is the child of deceased veteran who qualified under items 4) and 5). Must go to state supported or Tec School. Eligibility terminates at age 26.
